## **PREPARATION FOR A CROWN**

Today we rebuilt your tooth using a fluoride releasing, tooth colored composite filling material and prepared your tooth for the final crown.

Despite the fact that we applied a desensitizer and made a well-fitting temporary, it is not unusual to experience some sensitivity between now and your next appointment.

Because the temporary cement is designed so that we can easily remove your temporary crown, it is possible for you to dislodge it prematurely. It is advisable to **AVOID** sticky foods, candy and gum. Please exercise care when flossing (pull out to the side).

The temporary is important in protecting your tooth and maintaining the teeth in their proper positions. Therefore, it must remain over your tooth until the permanent crown is cemented. If it becomes dislodged, you may purchase temporary cement at any pharmacy or you may call us immediately.

## **ANESTHETIC**

Even though we make every effort to administer the local anesthetic in a painless and non-traumatic manner, you may still experience some tenderness in the area of the injection site for the next 24-48 hours.

For this reason we recommend that you take an anti-inflammatory after your appointment. ( Advil, or Motrin.)
